INTRODUCTION TO ASYLUM

In this session we delve into asylum issues, looking at legislation and processes, what support asylum seekers can receive, and unpick the roles and responsibilities of agencies supporting them.



This training is suitable for people who may have no or little knowledge of asylum and those who want to increase their understanding.



3 hours online or in-person



- Understand the current UK asylum system and corresponding legislation.
- Identify some of the key current issues relating to asylum.
- Understand key sources of data and information.
- Understand some of the challenges that can affect asylum seekers and communities with asylum seekers, and how organisations may respond to some of these challenges.



WELCOMING AND SUPPORTING YOUNG REFUGEES

This session explores the needs and challenges faced by unaccompanied children seeking asylum in the UK and offers practical guidance for those supporting them.



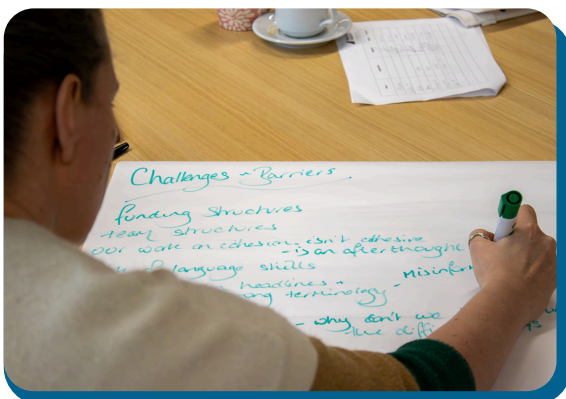
This training is for foster carers, social workers and professionals working with young refugees and asylum seekers.



3 hours online or in-person



- Acquire a general knowledge on processes such as NTS, NRM, age assessments and asylum policies that young people may experience the UK.
- Understand the reasons young people flee, the journey, life and social experiences that have an impact on young people's engagement and mental health.
- Learn about emotional challenges faced by young people and how to support them in a trauma-informed way.
- Gain information and awareness of national agencies and resources which will inform and support professionals while working and supporting young people.
- Have a platform to share best practices and learn from others' experiences.



INTRODUCTION TO MOVE-ON TRAINING



Do you know what happens when someone receives a positive decision on their asylum claim? We'll explore the 'move-on' period, looking at what people need to do as they transition out of the asylum support system, and what organisations should do to support in this short period of time.



This training is suitable for people who may have no or little knowledge of 'move-on' and those who want to increase their understanding. 2 hours for online; 3 hours in-person



- Explore what happens when someone receives a positive decision on their asylum claim.
- Explain the 'move-on' period, including accommodation and destitution
- Look at the main priorities for integration for new refugees.
- Understand some of the challenges and how organisations may respond.

INTRODUCTION TO COHESION IN COMMUNITIES WITH NEW MIGRANTS

Do you know what is the difference between 'integration' and 'cohesion'? In these challenging times, this session will help you understand why cohesion is important for all. We will explore current barriers and challenges to cohesion, especially in areas with new migrants, and consider practical ways to bring your local community together and build meaningful connections



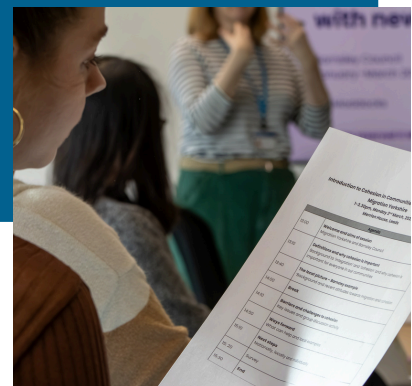
